Prophetic Insights to Daily Living
The Voice of the Lord – [Psalm 29:3-9](#)

The word “voice” is used in many ways today. We have voice mail. We give voice to our opinions. Writers have a quality to their writing called “voice” which is their unique style of writing. And of course, we have a voice when we speak by [making sounds](#) with our vocal cords.

However, *the voice of the Lord* is an entirely different thing. He causes all kinds of things to happen by *His supernatural voice*. David wrote about it in *Psalm 29:3-9*:

3*The voice of the LORD is on the waters: the God of glory thunders: the LORD is on many waters.*

4*The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is full of majesty.*

5*The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars; yes, the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon.*

6*He makes them also to skip like a calf; Lebanon and Sirion like a young unicorn.*

7*The voice of the LORD divides the flames of fire.*

8*The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness; the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.*

9*The voice of the LORD makes the hinds to calve, and discovers the forests: and in his temple does every one speak of his glory.*

The scripture that strikes me most is verse 4: *The voice of the Lord is full of [majesty](#)*. The online dictionary defines [majesty](#) as: **a.** The greatness and dignity of a sovereign. **b.** The sovereignty and power of God. It's not just that the Lord is full of majesty but His voice is also full of majesty. There is sovereignty (authority) and power in His voice which is His Word.

We need to hear the voice of the Lord when he speaks in order to avoid the pitfalls of life receive from him what He has promised. Here is an example from [Exodus 15](#): God delivered the Israelites from Egypt by bringing upon them the seven plagues. But after fleeing into the desert of Shur the Israelites found only bitter water. Moses threw a stick into the water that God showed him and it became sweet. In verse 26 it says: *“If you listen carefully to the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD, who heals you.”* Then in verse 27 it says: *Then they came to Elim, where there were twelve springs and seventy palm trees, and they camped there near the water.*

So be attentive and listen to the *voice* of the Lord when He speaks and you will find water for your soul because his voice is majestic!

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
